**An oasis** in the middle of Lehurutshe, Unjani Clinic is situated within the grounds of the NWDC Lehurutshe Complex and is an Enterprise Development Initiative aimed at:

- Empowering professional Black female nurses;
- Creating permanent jobs, and
- Perfecting a sustainable clinic model for providing primary healthcare.



Originally pioneered by Imperial Health Sciences, a division of Imperial Logistics (Imperial Group Limited), the concept was developed out of the need for the urgent transformation in the healthcare system in South Africa, the fact that our country faces the triple affliction of HIV, AIDS & TB; the fact that 84% of our population

are dependent on an overburdened public sector system; and a costly curative-care based model vs. disease prevention and promotion.

The initiative is delivered through a non-profit Company registered as Unjani Clinics NPC, who acts as the support structure in the relationship.

The owner of the Unjani Franchise in Lehurutshe, Patricia Motshwane, is a friendly, warm-hearted and passionate woman with deep love and empathy for not only her patients but all fellow human beings.

A qualified nurse and resident of Lehurutshe, Patricia discovered the franchise opportunity via the internet whilst scouring for ideas on how she can make a difference in the lives of the local people and how she could give back to the community.

Patricia identified everything she wanted to accomplish in Unjani Clinics and today, after nearly a year and a bit in business, her dreams have come true.

Equipped with two neatly joined air-conditioned containers that house a reception, waiting area, a consultation room, toilet and all the medical supplies and equipment needed, Patricia and her staff offer a full range of primary healthcare services from Monday to Saturday. At a nominal fee of R200, patients get to experience professional healthcare advice, are provided with relevant medication and walk away feeling that their health needs have been lovingly addressed and taken care of.
